- 7. As per the provisions of Section 72 of the Act, the facility for making nomination is available for the Members in respect of shares held by them. Members who have not yet registered their nomination are requested to register the same by submitting Form No. SH-13.Members are requested to submit the said details to their DP in case the shares are held by them in electronic form and to Bigshare Services Private Limited in case the shares are held in physical form.

Corporate Members intending to send their authorized representatives to attend the Meeting pursuant to Section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013 are requested to send to the Company a certified true copy of the Board Resolution authorizing their representative to attend and vote on their behalf at the meeting at least 3 days before the AGM.

10. Voting through electronic means

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (as amended), and the Circulars issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs dated April 08, 2020, April 13, 2020 and May 05, 2020, the Company is providing facility of remote e-Voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the 36th AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL) for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-Voting system will be provided by NSDL. A member who has cast his vote prior to the date of the meeting may also attend the meeting but shall not be entitled to vote at the meeting. It is hereby clarified members attending the meeting, who have not cast their vote by remote e-voting, shall be able to exercise the right to vote at the meeting through ballot papers. The instruction for e-voting are given under Note no. 14 hereunder.

- 11. Details as required in sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 36 of the SEBI Listing Regulations and Secretarial Standard on General Meeting (SS-2) of ICSI in respect of the Director seeking re-appointment at the Annual General Meeting, forms an integral part of the Notice.
- 12. At the 32nd AGM held on 29th September, 2017, Members approved the appointment of M/s. Haren Parekh & Co., as the Statutory Auditors of the Company having Registration No. 114076W, for a term of five consecutive years i.e., from the conclusion of the 32nd AGM till the conclusion of the 37th AGM of the Company to be held in the year 2022, subject to ratification of their appointment by the Members at every AGM of the Company. The requirement to place the matter relating to the appointment of auditors for ratification by Members at every AGM has been done away with by the Companies (Amendment) Act, 2017 with effect from May 7, 2018. Accordingly, no resolution is being proposed for ratification of the appointment of Statutory Auditors at the 36th AGM.
- 13. The Register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and their shareholding maintained under Section 170 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Register of Contracts or Arrangements in which Directors are interested, maintained under Section 189 of the Act will be available for inspection by the Members at the AGM.

14. The instructions for shareholders voting electronically are as under:

i) The remote e-voting period begins on 27th August, 2021 at 09:00 A.M. and ends on 29th August, 2021 at 05:00 P.M. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The voting right of shareholders shall be in proportion to their share in the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date,

- being 23rd August, 2021. Once the vote on a resolution is cast by the Member, the Member shall not be allowed to change it subsequently.

- 6. Once you confirm your vote on the resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.



STATE OF COMPANY AFFAIRS & RESULTS OF OPERATION

The Company registered a total income of Rs 10,98,340/- as compared to Rs. 11,62,181/- in the previous year. The Company registered a Loss after tax of Rs. 2,23,291/- as compared to a Loss after tax of Rs, 2,31,225/- in the previous year which was due to the decline in other income. There was no change in the nature of business of the Company and the Company has not earned any revenue during the period under review.

The Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 2021 have been prepared in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Indian Accounting Standards (IND AS) specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act") read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

Overview:

The global growth story continues to decelerate from 2019, marked by a weakness in trade and investments. This trend was visible in advanced and emerging markets. With the uncertain growth and a slowdown in credit demand, financing companies are expected to turn cautious, going forward. The sector faced liquidity pressure with higher funding cost and is expected to face headwinds for asset quality. The profitability is expected to be under pressure, with lower credit growth and higher credit cost.

Outlook:

The coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak at the start of 2020 unleashed a health and economic crises, unprecedented in scope and magnitude, with lockdowns and border closures paralyzing economic activity and laying off millions of workers across the world. With extensive restrictions on economic activities, the global economy was at a virtual standstill through the second quarter of 2020. Note No. 1

1.1 CORPORATE INFORMATION

Easy Fincorp Ltd ("the Company") is a listed entity incorporated in India with its Registered Office situated at c/o: SAREGAMA INDIA LTD, 2nd Floor, Universal Insurance Building, P.M Road, Fort, Mumbai – 400 001. The equity shares of the company are listed on Bombay Stock Exhange in India.

1.2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A.1 Basis of preparation and presentation

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared to comply with the Indian Accounting standards ('Ind AS'), including the rules notified under the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

The accounts have been compiled on an accrual system based on principle of going concern.

- A.2 Company's financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees, which is also its functional currency. All amounts have been rounded off to 2 decimal places to the nearest rupee.
- A.3 The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for following assets and liabilities which have been measured at fair value amount:
 - i Certain financial assets and liabilities,
 - ii Defined benefit plans plan assets

B. Summary of significant accounting policies

a Finance Cost:

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets.

All other borrowing costs are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss for the period for which they are incurred.

b Provisions:

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

c Employee Benefits Expense :

Short Term Employee Benefits: The undiscounted amount of short term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognised as an expense during the period when the employees render the services.

d Tax Expenses:

Income tax comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss, except to the extent that it relates to a business combination or an item recognised directly in equity or in other comprehensive income.

Current tax - Current tax comprises the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year and any adjustment to the tax payable or receivable in respect of previous years. The amount of current tax reflects the best estimate of the tax amount expected to be paid or received after considering the uncertainty, if any related to income taxes. It is measured using tax rates (and tax laws) enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date

Deferred tax:

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the corresponding amounts used for taxation purposes. Deferred tax is also recognised in respect of carried forward tax losses and tax credits.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be used

Deferred tax assets recognised or unrecognised are reviewed at each reporting date and are recognised /reduced to the extent that it is probable / no longer probable respectively that the related tax benefit will be realised

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

The measurement of deferred tax reflects the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the reporting date, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities

The Company offsets, the current tax assets and liabilities (on a year on year basis) and deferred tax assets and liabilities, where it has a legally enforceable right and where it intends to settle such assets and liabilities on a net basis

e Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured, regardless of when the payment is being made. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, taking into account contractually defined terms of payment.

Revenue from rendering of service is recognised when the performance of agreed contractual task has been completed.

Interest Income - Interest income is recognised using Effective Interest Rate (EIR) method. Income on Inter Corporate Deposits is accounted for on time accrual basis

It is the policy of the company to provide for all income and expenses on accrual basis.

Dividends - Revenue is recognised when the Company's right to receive the payment has been established.

f Financial instruments

¡ Financial Assets

a Recognition and measurement

All financial assets and liabilities are initially recognized at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities, which are not at fair value through profit or loss, are adjusted to the fair value on initial recognition. Purchase and sale of financial assets are recognised using trade date accounting.

b Other Equity Investments

All other equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss, except for those equity investments for which the Company has elected to present the value changes in 'Other Comprehensive Income'.

ii Financial liabilities

Recognition and measurement - All financial liabilities are recognized at fair value and in case of loans, net of directly attributable cost. Fees of recurring nature are directly recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss as finance cost.

For trade and other payables maturing within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying amounts approximate fair value due to the short maturity of these instruments.

iii Offsetting:

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the balance sheet when, and only when, the Company currently has a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and it intends either to settle them on a net basis or realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously

g Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and Cash Equivalents consist of cash on hand, cash at banks, demand deposits from banks and short term, highly liquid instruments.

h Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

Diluted earnings per share are computed by dividing the profit after tax as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

Classification of current / non current assets and liabilities

All assets and liabilities are presented as current or non current as per the Company's normal operation cycle and other criteria set out in Schedule III of the Companies Act,2013 and Ind AS 1 Presentation of financial statements.

Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current/non current classification of assets and liabilities.

j Cash flow statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit for the period is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are seggregated. The company considers all highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash to be cash equivalents.

C. ACCOUNTING JUDGEMENTS AND ESTIMATION OF UNCERTAINITY

Provisions

Provisions and liabilities are recognized in the period when it becomes probable that there will be a future outflow of funds resulting from past operations or events and the amount of cash outflow can be reliably estimated. The carrying amounts of provisions and liabilities are reviewed regularly and revised to take account of changing facts and circumstances.
